ASM 2024

This year, I am pleased to introduce our three international keynote speakers:

Professor Bruce M. Wenig (Chair and Senior Member, Dept of Pathology, Moffitt Cancer Center, USA) will be speaking on Endocrine and Head & Neck Surgical Pathology.

Professor Iris D. Nagtegaal (Radboud University, Nijmegen, The Netherlands) will be discussing Gastrointestinal (colorectal) Pathology.

Professor Fausto J. Rodriguez (Chief of Neuropathology, David Geffen School of Medicine at UCLA, Los Angeles, CA, USA) will cover Neuropathology.

Pacific Island Forum: In response to enthusiastic requests, a special companion club for Pacific Island Pathologists will be held on Saturday.

To enhance convenience, the program is designed to conclude by lunchtime on Sunday.

- Vincent McGovern Memorial Lecture: On Saturday, Dr. Amanda Charlton (LabPLUS, Department of Histopathology, Auckland City Hospital, Te Toka Tumai, Auckland, Aotearoa, New Zealand) will present Pattern Recognition, Diagnostic Reasoning, and Cognitive Bias.
- **Saturday Master Class**: Professor Fausto J. Rodriguez will lead a session on the Diagnostic Pathology of Peripheral Nerve Sheath Tumors.
- **Sunday Master Class**: Dr. S. Ming Chai (PathWest Laboratory Medicine, Fiona Stanley Hospital, QEII Medical Centre, and Royal Perth Hospital) will present Oh, the Places You'll Go with Cytology!

I hope these changes will add both value and convenience to the participants.

I sincerely thank all the convenors who have organized fantastic presentations. Special thanks to Abstract Convenor Dr. Ian Brown and the Abstract Review Committee: Amanda Charlton, John Nicholls, Julie Lokan, and King Tan.

IAP Grant

We continue to offer an IAP Grant to support pathology education for medical schools in Australasia, aiming to engage medical students with anatomical pathology in our region.

2023 IAP Grant was awarded to a student from Sydney Medical School for his project "Pathoquest," a mobile application/game to help medical students learn and review anatomical pathology in a fun and engaging way. He received AUD \$1000 to complete the project by July 2, 2024.

Applications for the 2024 Grants opened in March and will remain open until May 24, 2024. All applications will be reviewed by the Executive Committee, and the successful recipient will be notified.

Upcoming Changes in the Executive and Board of Directors

We have been notified by IAP Central that Prof. Gelareh Farshid's two-year term as Director (IAP Central Executive Council Representative) is ending this year. With the Executive Committee's approval, we have requested IAP Central to renominate her for a further two years, as she has shown interest in continuing. We thank her for her services. It is planned to align the duration of this position to a maximum of six years to align with other board position terms. This will be discussed at the upcoming board meeting, and if agreed, a constitutional change will be proposed at the AGM in 2025.

Dr. Michael Hitchcock has recently resigned from his role as NZ Councillor. On behalf of the Executive Committee and Board Members, I thank Michael for his enormous contribution to our division. The position was advertised to our membership and we have received one nomination which has been tabled at this Board meeting. The applicant if successful will act as an Interim Director until AGM 2025, during which she will be formally nominated by the members.

Dr Ingrid Fewings has also resigned from her role as Trainee Representative as she is not a registrar anymore and has become a qualified Pathologist. . The position will be advertised to our membership and will be filled soon. Again on behalf of the Board, I thank Ingrid for her valuable contribution to our division.

AGM 2025 Updates

The AGM 2025 brings about significant changes within our division:

- My two-year tenure as President will conclude after the AGM 2025, and Catriona McKenzie will assume this position.
- Fiona Maclean will leave the Board, creating a vacancy for the President-Elect role, which will be advertised to our membership before the AGM 2025.
- Alfred Lam will conclude his six-year term as Honorary Secretary at the AGM 2025, and this role will also be advertised to our membership before the AGM.
